Over the last six decades tourism has expanded to become one of the largest economic sectors in the world. Receipts from international tourism, excluding international fares, rose dramatically from US\$ 2 billion in 1950 to reach US\$ 475 billion by 2010 (UNWTO, 2011a, 2011e). If we also take domestic tourism into consideration, the tourism volume figures would be some six to ten times greater. In 2010, based on slightly different methodologies, tourism contributed between 5 and 9 percent to gross domestic product (GDP) and 6 and 9 percent to world employment (UNWTO, 2011e); (WTTC, 2011). While in some advanced economies tourism's contribution to GDP might be minimal, in some developing destinations tourism might create a significant share of GDP and employment.
